What Does a Dental Hygienist Do?

A Dental Hygienist is a licensed health professional who provides preventive and therapeutic oral health services to the public.

Dental Hygienists assess a person's oral health by examination, taking x-rays and intra-oral photographs. They remove soft and hard deposits from the teeth both for prevention and treatment of gum disease. Hygienists can administer local anesthesia and nitrous oxide. They apply agents such as fluoride and sealants to prevent cavities. The hygienist provides thorough oral health education to achieve and maintain oral health.





Facts About Dental Hygienists

According to the California Employment Development Department, the need for Dental Hygienists from 2012-2022 will increase by 23.4% with 1,060 average annual job openings. As in all allied health professions, the overall health of the economy affects actual employment needs.

To become a Registered Dental Hygienist (RDH) the applicant must graduate from one of the 334 accredited Dental Hygiene programs in the nation and pass both a national and regional written exam.

Community colleges offer entry-level programs while four-year institutes offer Bachelor's and/or Master's degree programs. Foothill College and West Los Angeles College have been approved for participation in the California Community Colleges Baccalaureate Degree Pilot Program. 
